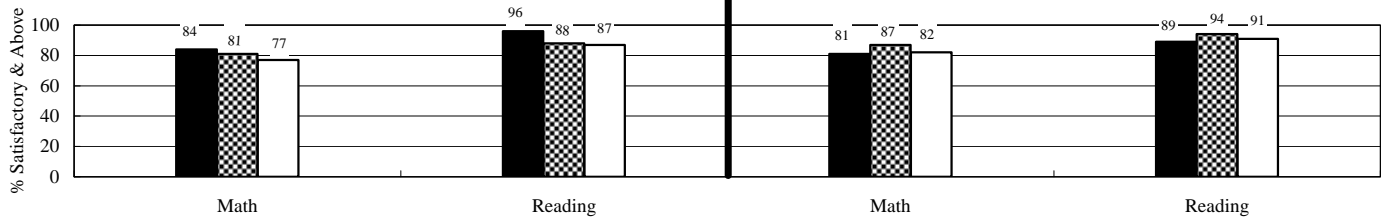

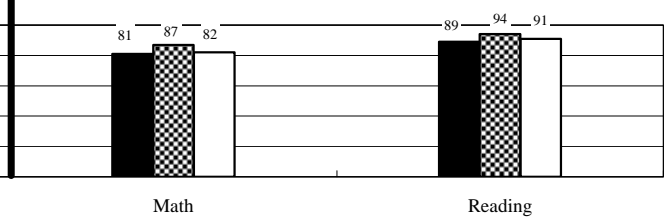

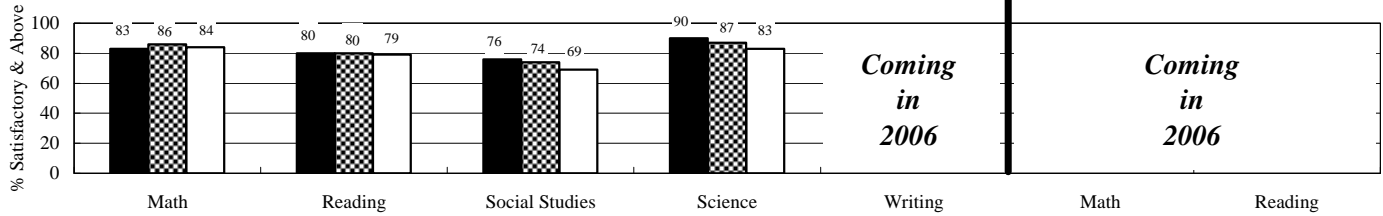
### 3rd Grade Tests \*



### 4th Grade Tests \*



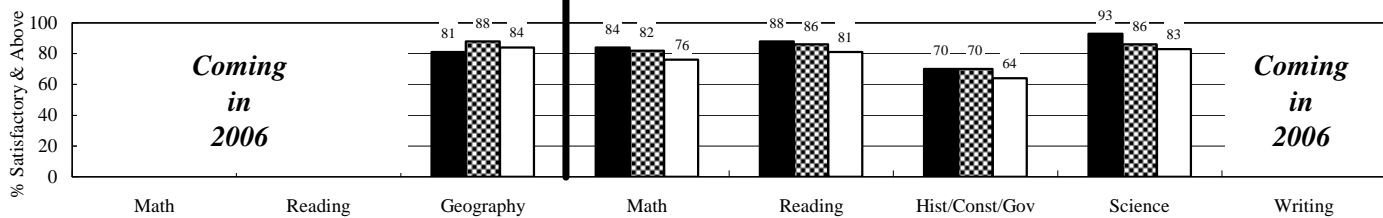

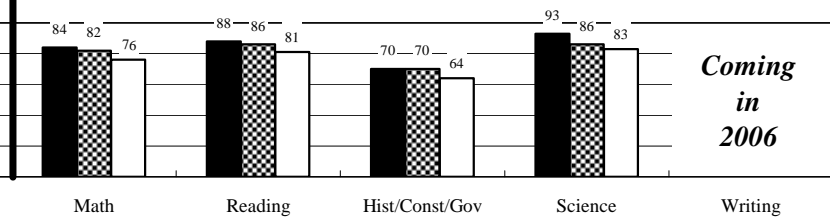

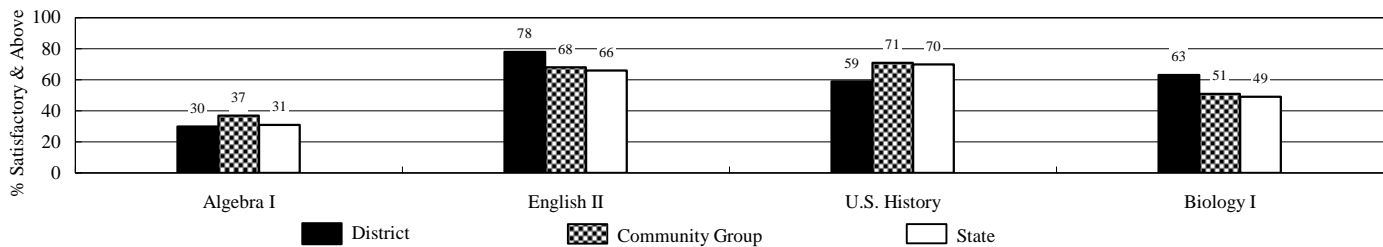
