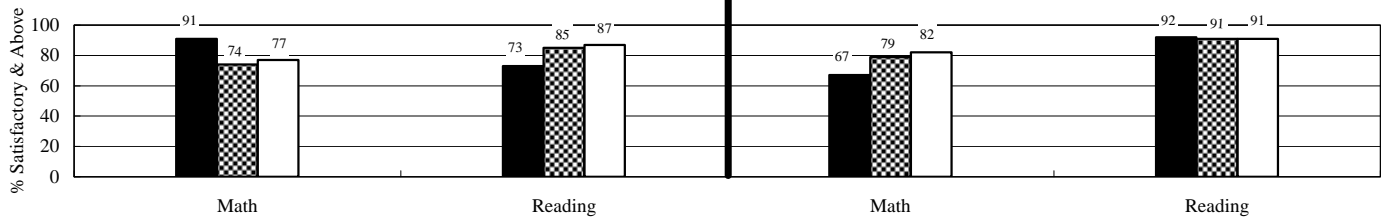

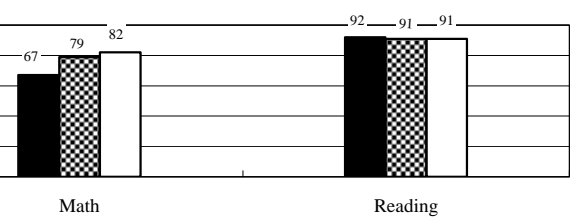

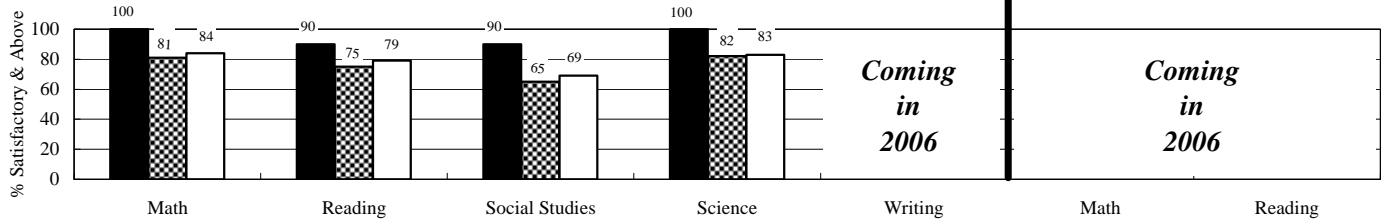
3rd Grade Tests *



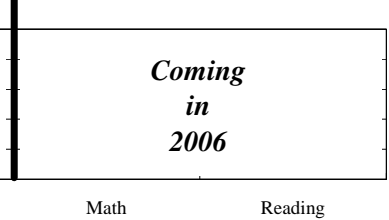
4th Grade Tests *



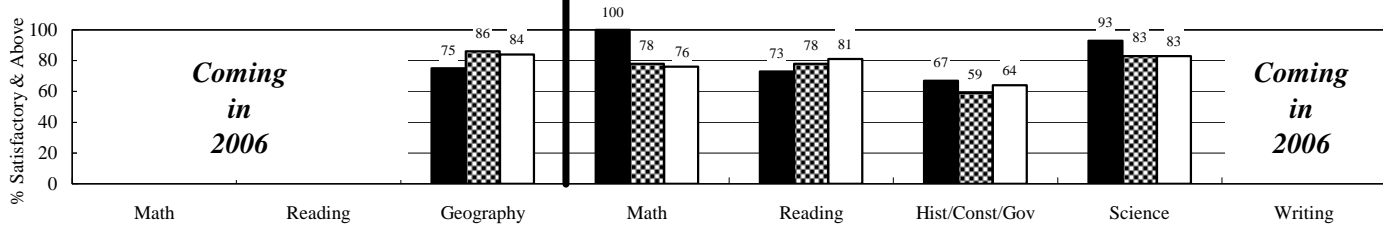
5th Grade Tests *



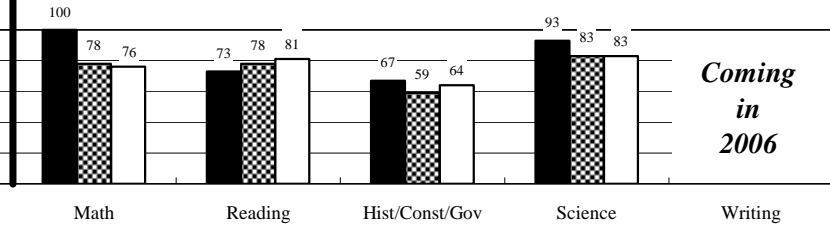
6th Grade Tests *

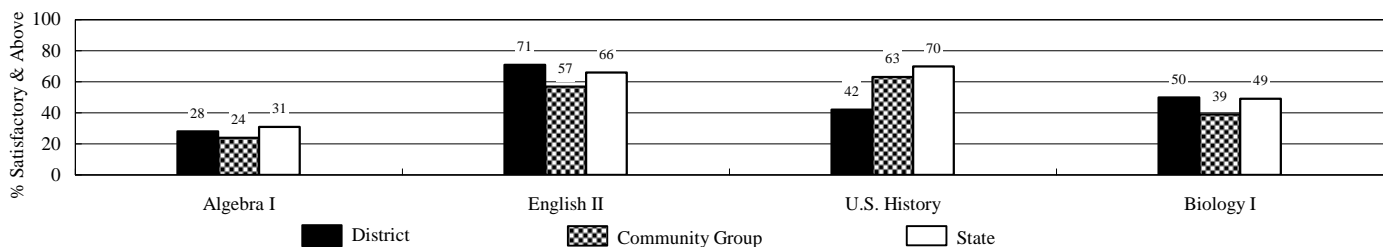
