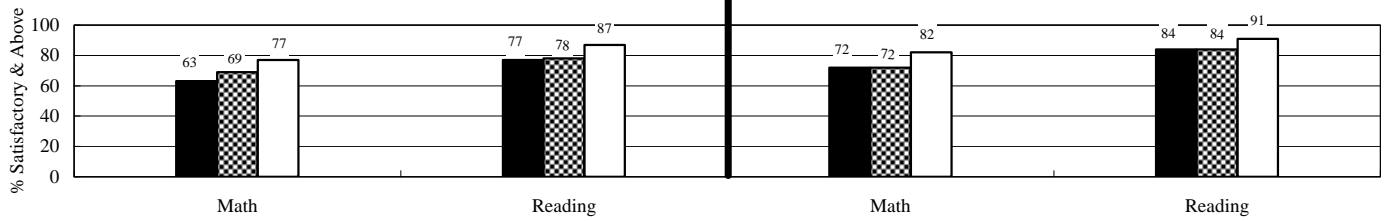

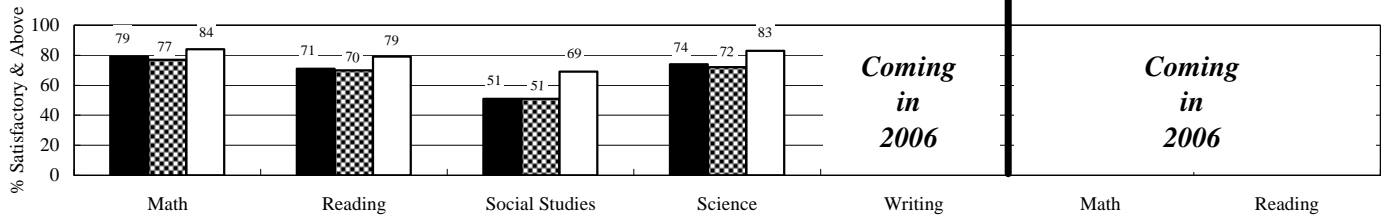

4th Grade Tests *



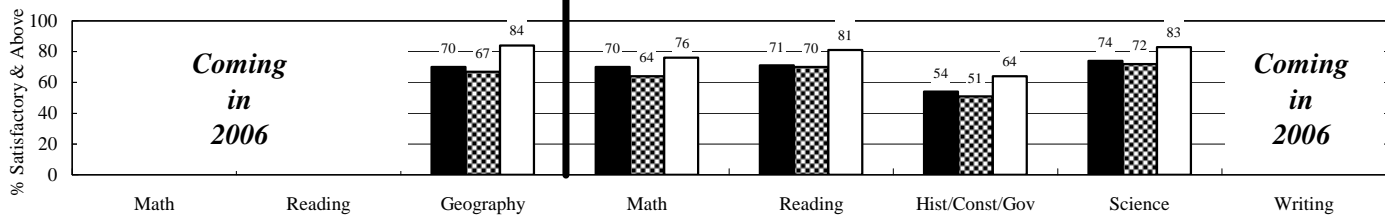
5th Grade Tests *

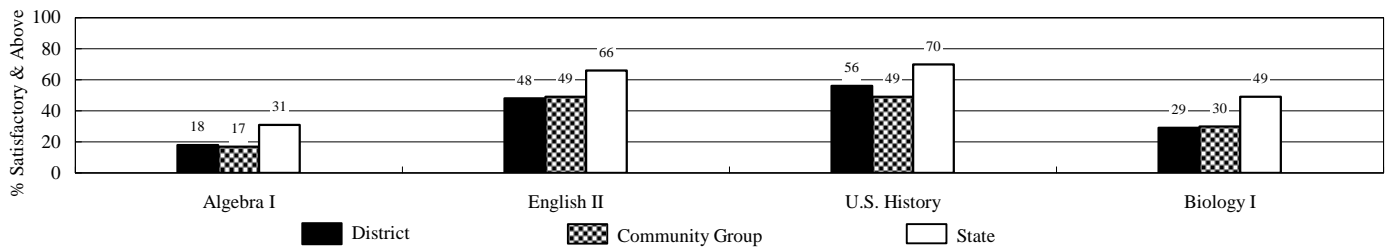
