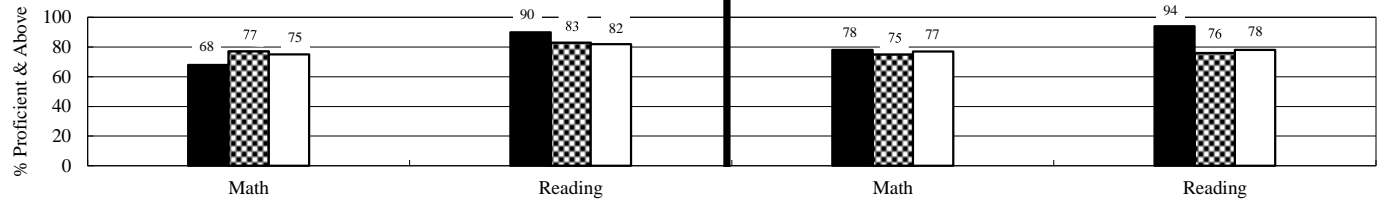

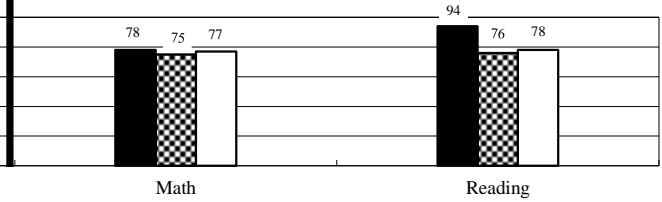

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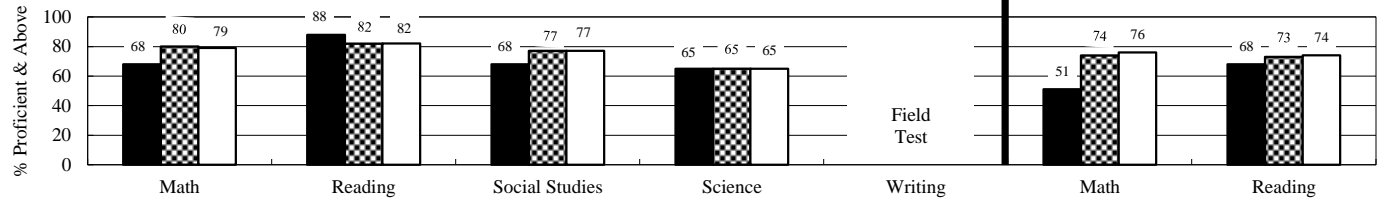
3rd Grade Tests*



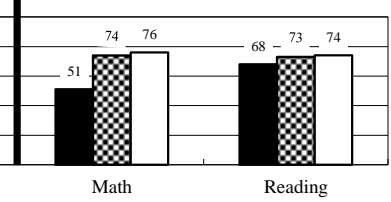
4th Grade Tests*



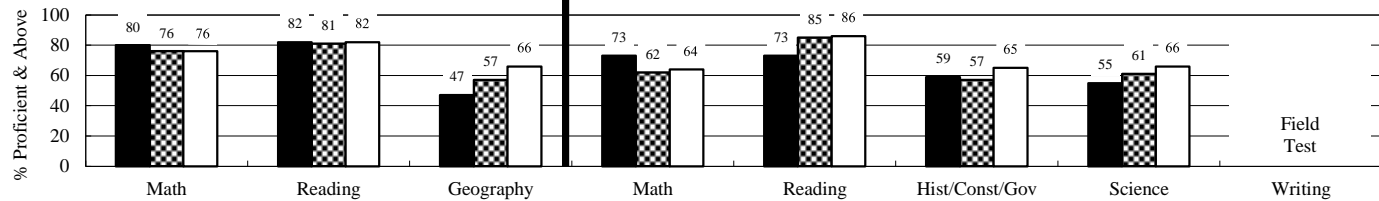
5th Grade Tests*

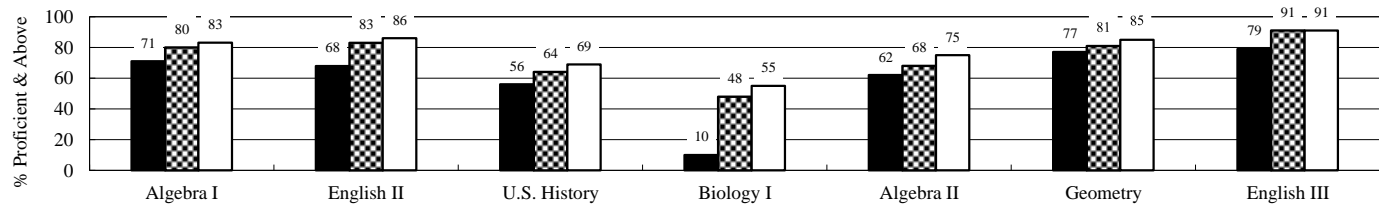
