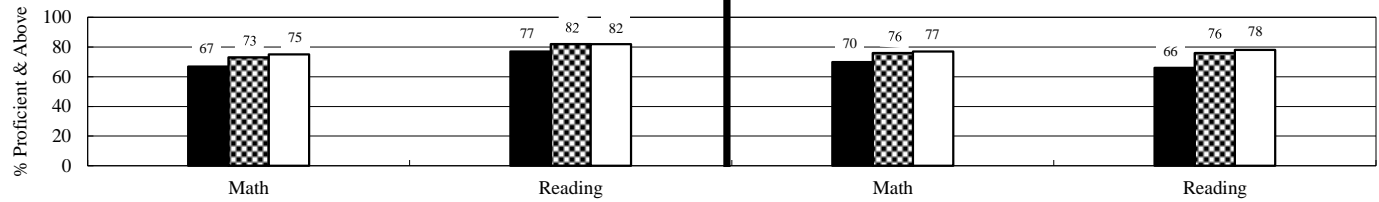

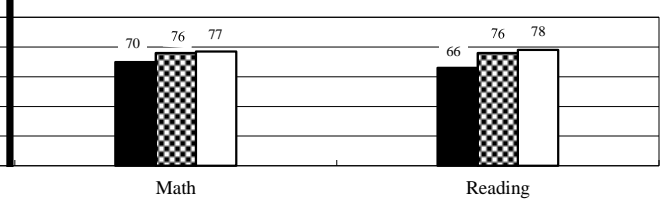

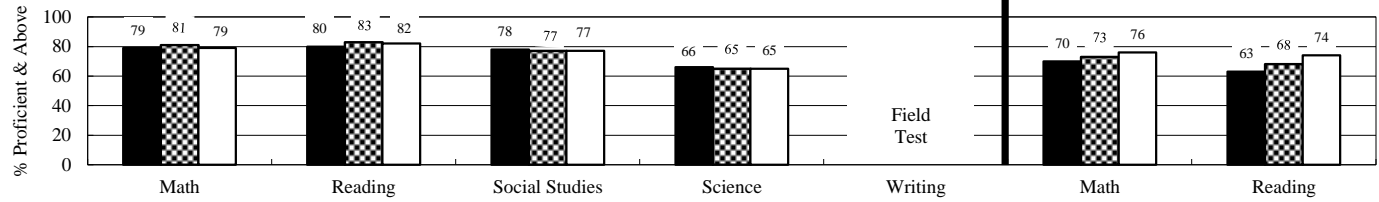
### 3rd Grade Tests\*



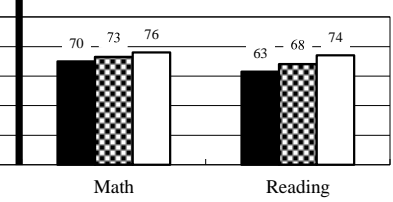
### 4th Grade Tests\*



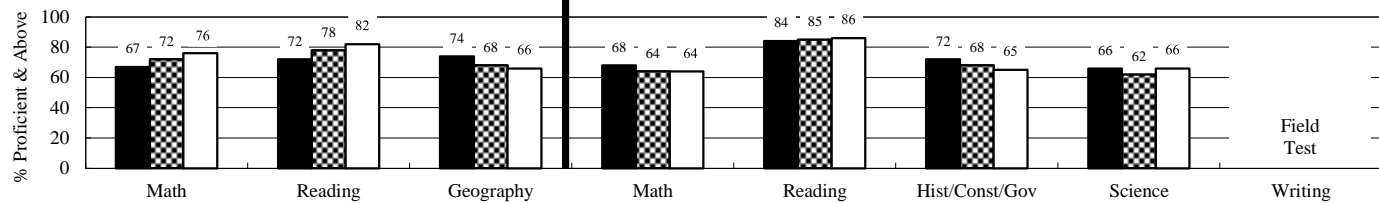

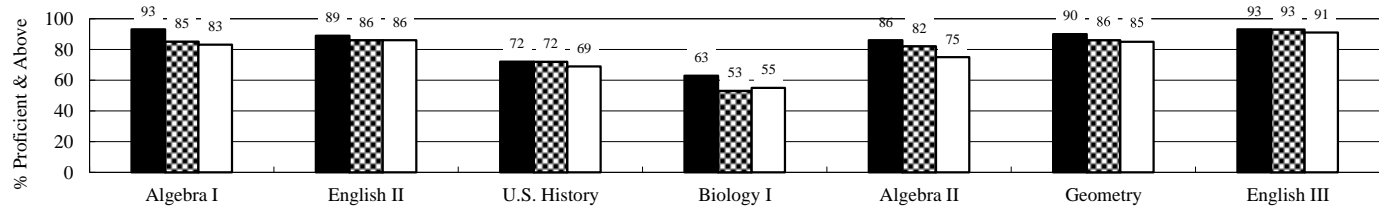
