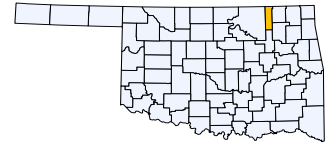

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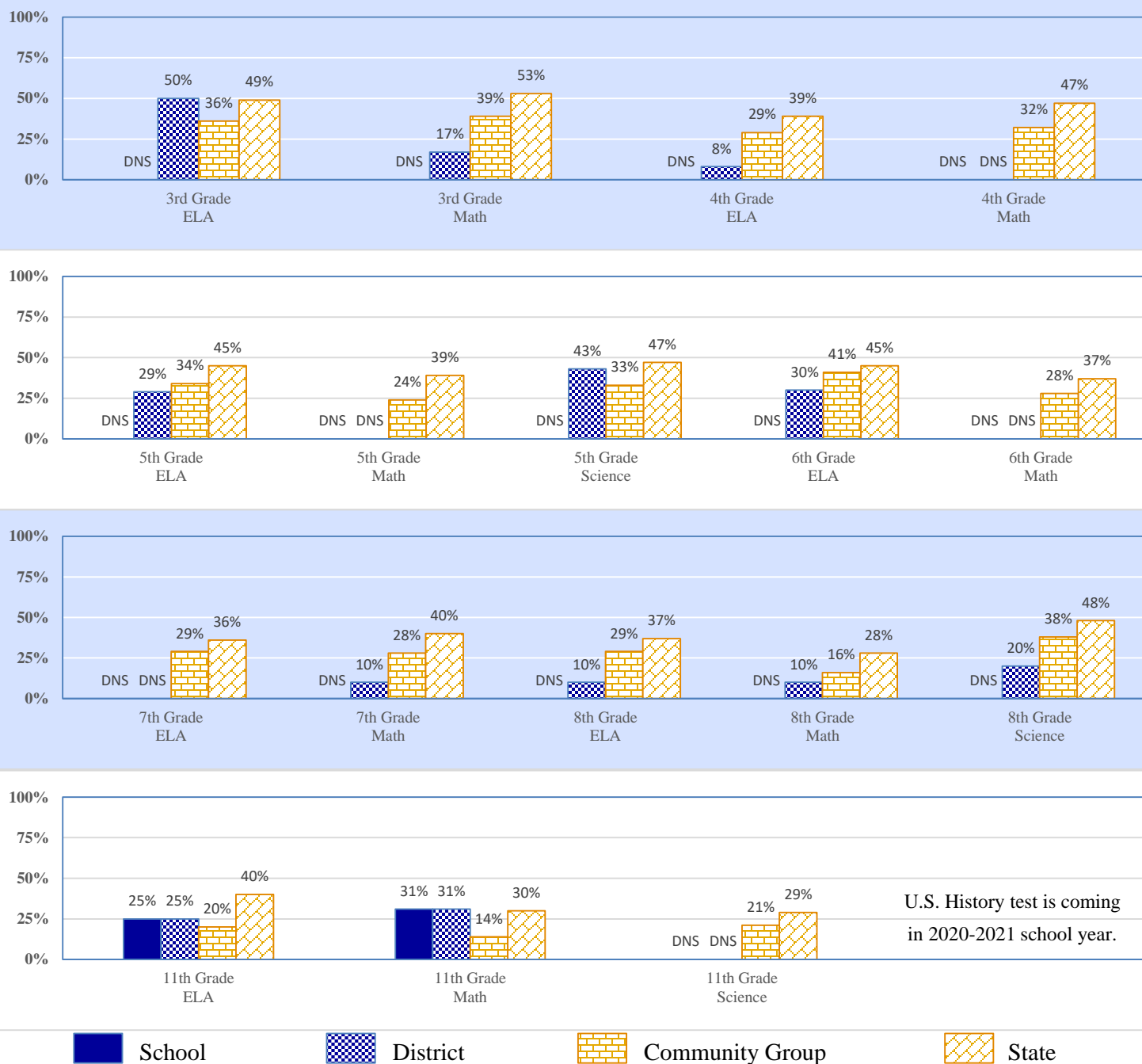

% of Students Scoring Proficient and Above by Grade and Subject



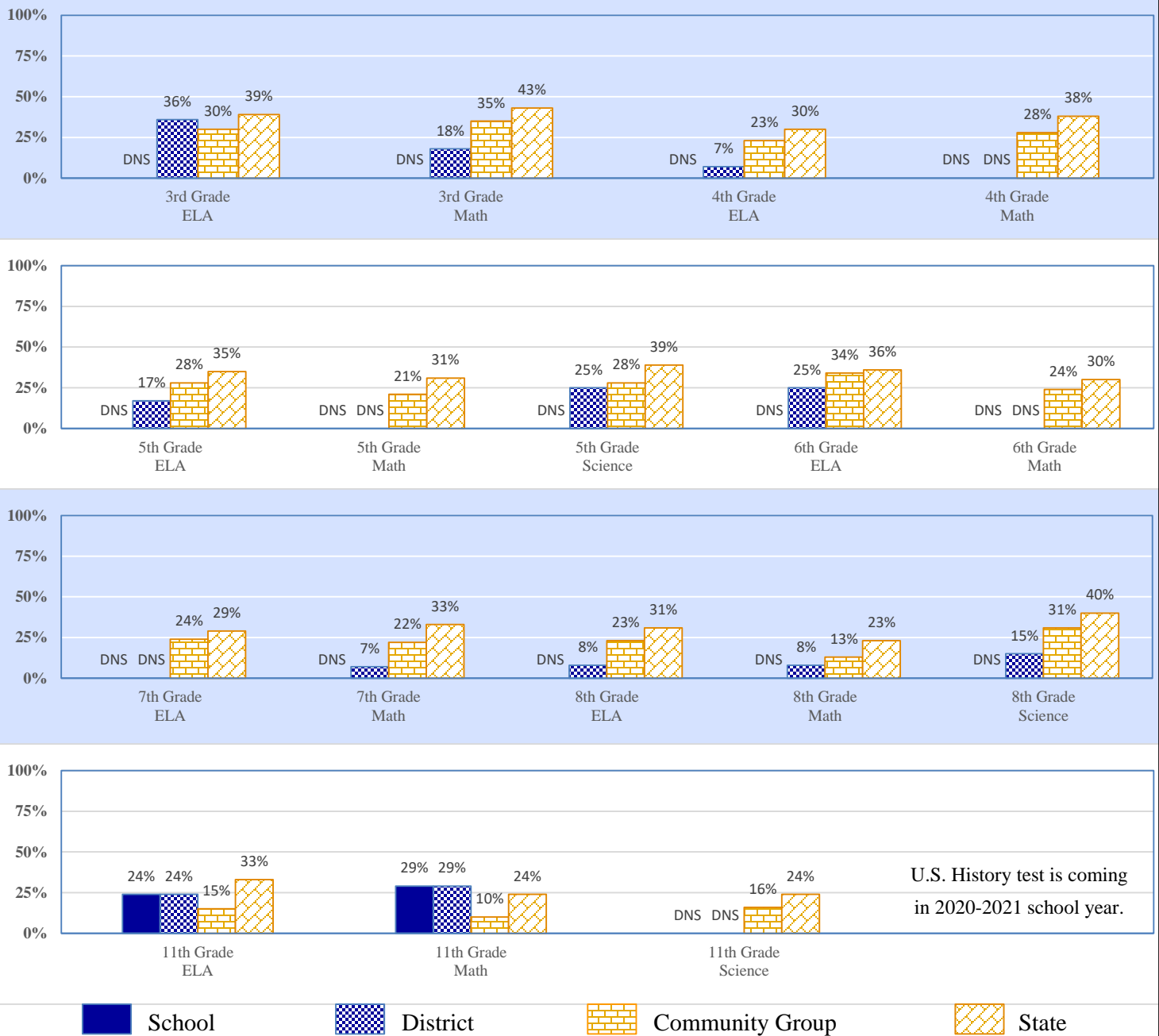
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2018-19 Student Performance (All Students)
